Afrobarometer Round 6 Summary of Results for Morocco, 2015

Afrobarometer is an African-led, non-partisan research network that conducts public attitude surveys on democracy, governance, economic conditions, and related issues in more than 30 countries in Africa. Five rounds of surveys were conducted between 1999 and 2013, and Round 6 surveys are being carried out in 2014-2015. Afrobarometer conducts face-to-face interviews in the language of the respondent's choice with nationally representative samples of between 1,200 and 2,400 respondents.

Afrobarometer is produced collaboratively by social scientists from across Africa. Coordination is provided by the Center for Democratic Development (CDD) in Ghana, the Institute for Justice and Reconciliation (IJR) in South Africa, the Institute for Development Studies (IDS) at the University of Nairobi in Kenya, and the Institute for Empirical Research in Political Economy (IREEP) in Benin. Michigan State University (MSU) and the University of Cape Town (UCT) provide technical support to the network.

The Afrobarometer National Partner in Morocco, Meda solutions, interviewed a nationally representative, random, stratified probability sample of 1,200 adult Moroccans from 02 November 2015 to 22 November 2015. A sample of this size yields results with a margin of error of +/-3% at a 95% confidence level. Previous survey have been conducted in Morocco in 2013. One To One for research and polling provided technical backstopping for the survey. Technical details of the survey, including descriptions of stratification and household selection, translation languages, and related information, can be found in the survey Technical Information Form that follows.

Below is an outline of the survey findings from all the questions posed to respondents. We also present the findings by some critical demographics such as gender and place of residence (urban-rural).

Notes:

The main reasons for the high refusal rate were as follows:

The lack of interest in surveys and politics. According to the data, almost 45% of Moroccan are not interested in public affairs. Also, feedback from fieldwork managers corroborate this.

- □ Fear of participating in surveys and expressing opinions about politics to avoid problems with authorities.
- The high rate of illiteracy. Morocco has the highest rate of illiteracy of the participating Arab countries. According to the last census (2014), the illiteracy rate is around 32%.
- The interview length. According to the feedback from the fieldwork teams, when interviewers inform respondents about the interview length before the interview, many refuse to take part.
