Summary of Results, June/July 2018

Afrobarometer is a pan-African, non-partisan research network that conducts public attitude surveys on democracy, governance, economic conditions, and related issues in African countries. Afrobarometer conducts face-to-face interviews in the language of the respondent's choice with nationally representative samples.

The Institute for Justice and Reconciliation, Afrobarometer's core partner for Southern Africa, commissioned a final pre-election survey in Zimbabwe. With technical assistance by Afrobarometer, the Mass Public Opinion Institute (MPOI) conducted fieldwork and public dissemination of results. MPOI interviewed 2,400 adult citizens between 25 June and 6 July 2018. A sample of this size yields country-level results with a margin of error of +/-2 percentage points at a 95% confidence level. The European Union Delegation to the Republic of Zimbabwe funded the pre-election survey.

Survey Overview Pre-Election Final Survey in Zimbabwe, June/July 2018

Dates of Fieldwork: 25 June to 6 July 2018

Sample size: 2,400

Sampling frame: 2018 projections from 2012 Zimbabwe Population Census

Sample universe: Citizens aged 18 years or older, excluding institutions

Sample design: Nationally representative, random, clustered, stratified, multi-stage area

probability sample

Stratification: Administrative province and urban-rural location

Stages: Rural areas: PSUs (from strata), start points, households, respondents

Urban areas: PSUs (from strata), start points, households, respondents

PSU selection: Probability Proportionate to Population Size (PPPS)

Cluster size: Eight households per PSU

Household selection: Randomly selected start points, followed by walk pattern using 5/10 interval

Respondent selection: Gender quota filled by alternating interviews between men and women;

respondents of appropriate gender listed, after which household member

draws a numbered card to select individual.

Weighting: Weighted to account for individual selection probabilities

Margin of error: +/- 2 percentage points at 95% confidence level
